Bashir AhmadFirst among firsts

The sudden death of Bashir Ahmad, who died of a heart attack at his home in Strathbungo, aged 68, came as a great shock to his family and many friends and neighbours. Though perhaps best known, in public life, as Scotland's first Asian, first Muslim and first non-white Member of the Scottish Parliament, in Strathbungo he will be remembered as a kind and thoughtful neighbour.

Born in Amritsar, as a young man, in 1961, he moved to Scotland to live with relatives in East Pollokshields. As he often recalled, he arrived at Glasgow airport from Pakistan not speaking a word of English and was helped that day to get to his destination by a bus driver who went off his route; a lasting introduction to the people of Glasgow and Scotland.



His career spanned bus-driving and the hotel and resturant business. In 1995, he founded Asians for Independence and from then was increasingly drawn to politics. In 2003, he was elected to the Pollokshields East ward of Glasgow City Council, becoming the SNP's first Asian councillor and in 2007 was elected as Scotland's first Muslim and Asian MSP, famously taking the oath in both English and Urdu and in traditional dress.

On his return home that day from the taking the oath, he arrived at Moray Place exhausted, only to be met by neighbours' excited children running up and congratulating him; he had tears in his eyes. In his private and community life, Bashir was a gentleman, always taking time to speak to neighbours and friends, tending his garden and being an active Muslim man of faith.

First Minister Alex Salmond MSP said of him, "He brought the dignity of his faith to the very centre of our democratic process and his lasting legacy will be one of hope, decency and inclusion."

As neighbours and friends, we will remember a very gentle man and all the joy he brought to his family, friends and neighbours. He is survived by his wife Naseem, seven children and eleven grandchildren.

Save Our Nurseries

Parents across the Southside have been protesting against proposals to close and merge a number of local nurseries.

A protest march against Proposal 21, which affects Nithsdale Road Nursery, Newark Drive Nursery and Pollokshields Nursery attracted hundreds of protestors and was featured on local TV news.

Education bosses plan to close all three nurseries and merge them to create a new early years centre on the site of the former Pollokshields Primary Annexe in Melville Street, saving £170,000. Just £400,000 has been earmarked to redevelop the existing north-facing grade II listed building, which is 1.5 miles away from Nithsdale Road Nursery.

It is part of plans to shut 25 city primary schools and nurseries which were being consulted upon during March. The results of the consultation are expected later this month and the Council will vote on the proposals on 23rd April.

The protest march was attended by a number of SNP councillors, MSP Nicola Sturgeon, who addressed the crowd, and Conservative Councillor David Meikle who said, "I was overwhelmed by the sheer number of people who turned out. Newark Drive and Nithsdale Road nurseries are full, the buildings are in good condition and they both deliver excellent education in lovely green surroundings."

Since the end of the consultation period parents have been advised by Fiona Hyslop, Secretary for Education and Lifelong Learning, that the decision to close the nurseries will need the consent of the Scottish Government because the nurseries are more than 80% full. This was queried by campaigners during the consultation process but Glasgow City Council officers denied this was the case as the law did not affect nursery schools.

Home from Home?

How would you like to spend a couple of nights in a townhouse conversion in the leafy Southside? Sound a bit too close to home? This is how some landlords are advertising short-term holiday lets available now in Strathbungo and Queens Park in properties purchased in residential areas and without applying for changes in planning permission.

The Strathbungo Society is concerned that a number of premises in Strathbungo appear to be being let on a short-term basis to host rowdy weekends in Glasgow. A public inquiry is expected to be held this summer concerning this use of residential flats as holiday lets and it's hoped it could provide answers for residents who feel powerless to act against the short-term residents of the 'hotel' that's opened, without planning permission, in the house next door.

Shawlands and Strathbungo Community Council has long supported residents living near Queens Park in their attempts to reduce anti-social behaviour stemming from nearby hostels and, more recently, short-term holiday lets.

The McKever Group owns the now-closed Parkview Hotel on Queens Drive, the Queens Park Hotel -which houses homeless people on behalf of a number of councils including Falkirk and East Renfrewshire - and 80% of the residential properties in 32 Balvicar Street.

The transient nature of these populations has led to an increase in reports of anti-social behaviour with many residents feeling they have little option but to leave the area.

Glasgow City Council has served a planning enforcement notice to stop the Balvicar Street flats being rented as holiday apartments but the McKever Group is currently appealing that order. A spokesperson from the McKever Group agreed that, "In isolated incidents we have evicted people who displayed anti-social behaviour and have introduced further security measures."

Residents feel they have not done enough and local planning experts feel that renting residential properties for short-term use requires changes to the existing planning permission and consents.

£1 Million Challenge

Govanhill Baths could reopen as soon as March 2011. At least that's the ambitious aim stated by the Govanhill Baths Community Trust at a meeting held this Spring.

The group has secured lottery funding for the project and found design partners and sponsors but they're now seeking to make their ambitious business plan a reality.

They need the support of the local community, Glasgow City Council and Holyrood to raise an additional £3m over the next year.

The ambitious regeneration project - for which a planning application is currently before Glasgow City Council - incorporates the re-opening of the pools and Turkish baths, a cafe and flexible community space within the existing building. A second phase of building will incorporate the old steamie building and extend it to provide recording studios, local enterprise suites and a nursery.

Nearly 100 residents attended the meeting, along with Frank McAveety MSP, Councillor Hanif and Councillor Alderslowe.

£1 million of the necessary £3 million still needs to be raised by the local community. THE END OF THE ROAD

The Strathbungo Society has begun consulting with residents who share ownership of one back lane about blocking the lanes to through traffic by placing bollards at the junctions.

The proposal will see a bollard placed at the back lane behind Pollokshaws Road next to William Hill on Nithsdale Rd and another bollard behind Moray Place at the Regent Park Square entrance. The response so far has been positive and we will be passing this on to the Council who will then decide whether to instigate formal traffic order proceedings in order to carry out the work.

If the lanes are blocked off the hope is to improve safety for pedestrians, reduce rat running and to enable the Society to use the Entrust grant to upgrade the condition of the back lanes where they have been blocked off.
