Mission Impossible?



This autumn the eyes of the Strathbungo Society have been turned to a potential project on our doorstep. The Nithsdale Mission Hall on Nithsdale Drive has been derelict since it was attacked by arsonists in 2005.

Prior to this, the Alexander Skirving-designed hall had been used primarily as a place of worship but fell into disuse. Most residents will be aware of the lack of public community spaces available in Strathbungo and it seems a shame to have such a fine building on the edges of the conservation area out of use and critically at risk. Members of the committee have been doing some

research and discovered that the property is now held for the common good and that the City Council is very interested in seeing it regenerated and returned to public use. We'd like to do just that but it's a huge undertaking. Cost estimates by the Council to make the building safe and watertight are around £500,000 (figures quoted in 2008) but we anticipate that to make the building a real community hub we may need to raise twice this figure. To get this project off the ground, the Society really needs to form a committee of volunteers who have the skills

and enthusiasm to see the project through. In particular, we'd like to get on board people who have experience of large grant applications and fundraising as well as structural engineers and architects who may have great ideas for the space. We believe that where there's a will there's a way and there is certainly funding available for this type of project but we need the community's help to make it happen. BINS IN THE BUNGO



As most residents will be aware, our regular refuse collection has been patchy since early November. The cause of this is an unofficial work-to-rule by refuse collection workers. Strathbungo is one of the worst-affected areas.

Councillor David Meikle told us that, "Where possible, additional resources are being deployed to contain this disruption. It has become clear during the last few weeks that those involved in this unofficial work-to-rule have deliberately not been reporting missed collections in an effort to generate as many complaints as possible. It is clear that this action is a direct response to the planned introduction of the new four-on-four-off working pattern in February 2010 - and I support this new working pattern as it will mean a seven-day cleansing service."

As a consequence of this misinformation, councillors were told the back log was only 4 or 8 hours when many of you had not had your bin emptied for three or five weeks. Land & Environmental Services will now provide a weekly update of the situation, or sooner should there be any significant developments. This information will be validated by staff from other parts of the Service who will monitor completed collection runs.

Land & Environmental Services are using all available information in order to direct services to the worst-affected areas. If you have any urgent or particular concerns you should report these to the Customer Care Centre on 0141 287 9700 or contact any of our city councillors directly.
